How the Supply Chain Crisis Unfolded

Ships stuck at sea, warehouses overflowing, trucks without drivers: The highly intricate and interconnected global supply chain is in upheaval, with little end in sight. The turmoil has revealed how the need to ship surgical masks to West Africa from China can have a cascading effect on Ford's ability to put back-up cameras on its cars at factories in Ohio and delay the arrival of Amazon Prime orders in Florida in time for the holidays. In one way or another, much of the crisis can be treated to the outbreak of COVID-19 as being depicted below.

China Approves Yuan 248.5bn Worth New Railways



China's National Development and Reform Commission (NRDC) has approved the construction of a new 350km/h high-speed line, a 160km/h main line and three metro lines in Wuxi, with overall investment totalling Yuan 248.5bn (USD 38.55bn).

The new 554.6km high-speed line will be constructed between Shanghai, Nanjing and Hefei. The Yuan 180bn line will consist of 519.9km of new line and 16

stations of which 10 will be new-build. The line is expected to carry 50 million passengers per year. The cost includes Yuan 6bn for rolling stock. Construction is expected to take seven years.

A 239km 160 km/h conventional line worth Yuan 17.8bn with 20 stations will link Ruijin in Jiangxi province and Meizhou in Guangdong province in the South of the country. It is planned to operate 13 pairs of passenger trains per day, and annual freight tonnage is forecast at 1.44 million tonnes. Construction is expected to take four and a half years.

Shipping Alliances Drop Hundreds of Asia-North Europe Port Calls Due to Congestion

Nearly a quarter of the scheduled port calls of Asia-North Europe alliance loops were omitted in the past five months, according to an Alphaliner survey. The consultant found the three alliances had cancelled 383 calls during the period, attributed to port congestion, throwing the supply chains of thousands of shippers into disarray. Importers have found their containers off-loaded at ports not in the original shipping plan and subjected to lengthy and fragmented relay services, while exporters have seen their cargo stranded at ports for weeks awaiting the next available sailing.

Moreover, some scheduling changes are being made last minute by the alliances, after discussion with operations centers around the world, and often without the correct level of communication with customers – sometimes even omitting to promptly inform the local country agents. Alphaliner said it had identified three reasons for the port omissions: an ad-hoc omission to limit delays; temporary removal of a call for a number of weeks; and blank or 'sliding' sailings where the alliance pushes a voyage back a week.

It has found that the Alliance members were blanking more voyages than 2M or Ocean Alliance partners, a consequence of THEA's strategy to maintain the majority of its pro forma calls in North Europe. It noted that six out of its 22 sailings during the survey period were cancelled due to the much longer round-trip voyage times of its ships.

Forwarders "Fear the Worst" and "Don't Have a Clue" on Shipping Rates Next Year



Container spot rates are edging up again across most tradelanes, with a big spike expected in January ahead of the Chinese New Year holiday. According to today's Ningbo Containerized Freight Index (NCFI), 15 of its 21 routes recorded modest increases against a continuing backdrop of tight capacity. From Asia to North Europe, Drewry's World Container Index (WCI) was flat, at USD 13,564 per 40ft, the Freightos Baltic Index (FBX) ticked up 1%, to USD 14,345, while the new Xeneta (XSI-C) index improved by 3%, to USD 14,443 per 40ft.

Several carriers are now reported to be offering forwarders and NVOCCs Asia-North Europe rates with a validity of just two weeks and declining to agree to any short-term contracts before CNY in February. A UK-based NVOCC with offices in China stated that this week it's carrier rep was continually "making excuses", stalling on contract negotiations and was "either lying or genuinely hadn't been told" about the carrier's contract policy for next year.

Meanwhile, on the transpacific, the WCI this week saw Asia-US components jump by 5% to the west coast, to USD 10, 138 per 40ft, and iby 4% for east coast ports, to USD 13, 118. The FBX, which includes premium fees, inched up 1% to the west coast, to USD 14,924 per 40ft, while east coast ports recorded an increase of 2.5%, to USD 17, 195.

U.S. Consumer Prices Climb at Fastest Annual Rate Since 1982

U.S. consumer prices rose last month at the fastest annual pace in nearly 40 years, magnifying how rapid and persistent inflation is eroding paychecks and increasing pressure on the Federal Reserve to tighten policy. The consumer price index increased 6.8% from November 2020, according to Labor Department data released Friday. The widely followed inflation gauge rose 0.8% from October, exceeding forecasts and extending a trend of sizable increases that began earlier this year.

The median forecasts in a Bloomberg survey of economists called for a 6.8% annual gain and a 0.7% advance in the monthly measure. The increase in the CPI reflected broad advances in most categories.

The data reinforce expectations the Fed will accelerate the wind down of its bond-buying program at the central bank's final meeting of the year next week. Central banks and politicians around the world have come under increasing pressure to address rising inflation as workers spend more at the grocery store and the gas pump.

Factories Shut and Ningbo Restricts Truckers in Zhejiang Province Lockdowns

Lockdowns across China's Zhejiang province have prompted multiple factory closures, and new restrictions have been placed on trucking. China reported new COVID-19 cases in Tianjin and Guangzhou this week, including the Omicron variant, but the outbreak in Zhejiang, another major manufacturing heartland, remains the most serious.

For example, 20 listed companies operating in the province have suspended operations, according to Reuters, including battery, textile and pharmaceutical manufacturers. They include those in Ningbo's Zhenhai district, a key petrochemicals hub, currently under lockdown, and Shangyu district in the neighboring city of Shaoxing, under partial lockdown, with all factories other than those producing essential items and PPE required to suspend production.

Retailers Hit for Added Transport Costs as "Wardrobing" Becomes the Fashion

"Wardrobing" is costing UK retailers more than £800m a year. Some 13% of 2,000 consumers surveyed admitted to "wardrobing" – purchasing an item to wear once before returning it for a full refund. Rebound, which conducted the survey, said: "Some retailers have started following Amazon in banning customers found to be repeatedly returning items."

Fashion has generally struggled to conduct returns efficiently, UK retailers collectively spending around £6.6bn a year for these services. "Wardrobing" is seen by 62% of retailers as having a "significant" impact on their costs, 23% saying it was "very significant". Consumers aged 25-34 are most likely to "wardrobe", with 21% admitting to it, compared with just 6% of those polled aged over 45.

Director of data innovation at Rebound Vicky Brock, suggested a data-driven policy was the best approach for retailers. "It's tempting, but banning shoppers for repeatedly returning items overlooks that customer's lifetime value," she said. "An effective returns strategy requires a nuanced, data-driven approach, which will highlight customers who 'wardrobe' but keep more than they return. By banning repeat returners, retailers risk alienating shoppers who spend far more than they claim in refunds.", she added. *Source: www.theloadstar.com*
