## SRI LANKA

Located in the Indian Ocean making it easily accessible from various parts of the world Sri Lanka serves as a central hub connecting Asia, Europe and Africa making it convenient for participants from different regions to travel to the conference.

Sri Lanka has invested significantly in developing its infrastructure, including modern airports, highways, and conference facilities. Major cities like Colombo and Kandy offer a wide range of venues and accommodation suitable for international conferences. Sri Lanka is known for its stunning natural landscapes, including beautiful beaches, lush tea plantations, and wildlife reserves.

The country also has a rich cultural heritage, with ancient temples, historical sites, and diverse traditions that can provide unique experiences for conference participants.



The flight routes to Sri Lanka will depend on your departure location. Direct flights to Sri Lanka are available from major cities such as London, Dubai, Doha, Melbourne, Singapore, Kuala Lumpur, and Delhi, among others.

If there are no direct flights available from your location, you may have to consider connecting flights through a transit hub.





## FLYING TO SRI LANKA



#### Bandaranaike International Airport (BIA)

BIA is the main gateway and is located about 35 kilometres north of Colombo, the capital city. Several major airlines operate flights to Sri Lanka from various destinations around the world. Some popular airlines that fly to Sri Lanka include Sri Lankan Airlines (the national carrier), Emirates, Qatar Airways, Etihad Airways, Singapore Airlines, and regional low-cost carriers.

#### VISA Requirements

Some nationalities may require a visa in advance, while others can obtain a visa on arrival. Visa cost for SAARC countries USD 22 and other nationals will be USD 50.

On arrival visa fee will be USD 60. Visa can be processed online at eta.gov.lk website. Delegates must ensure to meet the visa requirements and have the necessary documentation before boarding your flight.

## VISITING SRI LANKA

Sri Lanka is a lush, tropical island paradise, known to ancient Greek mariners as TAPROBANE. Arab traders called it Serendib – hence the word "serendipity", meaning discovery by happy accident. It was famously described by Marco Polo as "undoubtedly the finest island of its size in the world".

This is a culturally rich and environmentally diverse country, with nine World Heritage Sites (the oldest dating back to the 3rd Century BC); 86 species of mammals (including elephant and leopard) and more than 400 bird species (including 26 endemics); a colourful array of flowering plants and trees, and a Hill Country famous for tea; 14 National Parks out of 100 areas protected by the government; and an Indian Ocean coastline boasting palm-fringed and sandy tropical beaches.
