INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION

- ✓ At the 2015 International Convention held in Dubai, United Arab Emirates in September 2015, the President led the CILT Ghana's delegation made up of the Executive Secretary Mr. Ebo Hammond and Vice President Education & Professional Development Mr. Mark Amoamah. Other senior members of the institute also were part of the delegation.
- ✓ In all, a total of 17 delegates from Ghana were at the convention. This is an improvement on the previous events and it is our hope that more and more members would be interested in this year's convention in Montreal, Canada.



LOCAL ACTIVITIES

WiLAT Ghana

- ✓ On 17th July, 2015 WiLAT Ghana organized a Familiarization tour to the Atuabo Gas Processing Plant of the Ghana National Gas Company, located in the Western Region of Ghana.
- ✓ This is infrastructure that has been set up to gather process and transport natural gas produced from the Oil Rig (FPSO Kwame Nkrumah-Jubilee field) which is 58km off shore.
- √ The processed gas is transported via a 111km gas pipeline to feed a gas fired plant to generate electricity.



LOCAL ACTIVITIES

WiLAT Ghana

- ✓ WiLAT Ghana has had a number of both Executive and General Meetings; and Continuing Professional Development (CPD) Lectures for its local membership.
- ✓ Some of the topics treated include but not limited to "The Evolution of Aviation in Africa" which was organized in collaboration with CILT Ghana Accra Section on April, 2015 and was delivered by Dr. Mrs. Doreen Owusu-Fianko.
- ✓ As well as the prospects and challenges in the maritime industry delivered by Mr. Kumi Adjei-Sam, CMILT (Administrative Manager, Ghana Ports & Harbours Authority) and Vice President Maritime, CILT Ghana.



LOCAL ACTIVITIES

CILT Ghana Sections

- ✓ The Secretariat has been monitoring the activities of the various Sections (Accra, Tema, Kumasi and Takoradi) with keen interest. The Sections meet on various agreed dates and times of the year in their respective regions.

• Total income increased from GHC 173,383.27 in 2013 to GHC 297,094.06 in 2014. A net increase of GHC 123,710.79. Total expenditure of the Institute for the same period, increased by GHC 160,656.16 to GHC 291,407.60 in 2014 as compared to GHC 130,751.44 in 2013. - CILT Ghana Trained Coordinators from Its Accredited Training Providers
 - ✓ CILT Ghana in its efforts to maintain effective and efficient coordination of its professional programmes in Ghana organized a one-day training workshop for Coordinators of CILT Professional Programmes in all accredited Training Providers (ATPs) in the country.
 - ✓ The event saw a total of thirteen representatives from the seven (7)
 ATPs, Lecturers and some members of the Governing Council were
 trained.
 - ✓ In order to ensure the effective and efficient coordination and management of the new curriculum of its Professional Certificate, Diploma and Advanced Diploma programmes, the Institute had decided to train all Coordinators from each ATP on the new reforms introduced by CILT International.

 - ✓ The workshop took place on August 7, 2015 at GNAT Hall in Accra.

 - ✓ Major General Usman Commended CILT Ghana for organizing such training and encouraged us to attend this year's Africa Forum. He made a stop over in Ghana on his way to Uganda.

1. Participation in CILT Programmes Internationally

✓ CILT Ghana plans to participate fully in this year's CILT International Convention in Montreal, Canada and so far 36 delegates from CILT Ghana have registered.

2. Education & Professional Development

- ✓ To organize executive training programmes for members and nonmembers in the industry.
- ✓ Finalize the development of a comprehensive Masters Programme (Masters in Logistics & Transport- MALT) as a progression for our students in their Career Development.
- ✓ To work on accreditation of Koforidua Polytechnic to run CILT programmes.



3. Development of Electronic Membership Database Software

✓ I am also happy to report that the Institute has engaged the services of Bez Software Systems to develop an Electronic Membership Database Software.

✓ The software development is near completion and we hope to do the
final review and also finalize the monetary term.



4. Fellows Guild/League

- ✓ As part of influencing national policy and debate on logistics and transportation issues, CILT Ghana is establishing a Fellows Guild/League to serve as a "Think Thank"
- ✓ It will consist of Chartered Fellows (who are full members) and Associates (who are Governing Council Members and other Chartered Members occupying very senior management positions)
- ✓ And this is about to be launched today.



5. Seek for Territorial Status for CILT Ghana

- ✓ CILT Ghana has started the process towards achieving territorial status.
- ✓ We are hopeful that some of the measures we are putting in place such as the electronic membership database etc would see us through.
- ✓ We would be putting in an application with CILT International during the International Convention in Montreal, Canada.



6. Relaunch CILT Ghana Takoradi & Kumasi Sections

- ✓ As you may be all aware, Kumasi and Takoradi Sections have been very inactive for the past years with little or no activities.
- ✓ The Institute is making strenous efforts to re-organize these sections for relaunching.
- ✓ I am happy to report that Takoradi Section has interim executives in place and are working to revive the section.
- ✓ The institute has also tasked some members in Kumasi to led the revival of the Kumasi Section and we hope to make a head way.




7. Membership ID Card

- ✓ We are in the final stage of the process and we hope to roll it out before the year ends.












CILT Ghana Student Enrolment By Programme-2004-15
