MINUTES OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

2. Meeting called to order

2.1 The President called the meeting to order at 1000 hours as the Secretary General confirmed that there was enough quorum.

3. President's Address

3.1 The President welcomed the members for the AGM to discuss and resolve issues pertaining to our prestigious Institute.

3.2 The President Congratulates CILT Malaysia for her 50th Anniversary as CIT, as it was originally known as was formed on 16th June 1965.

3.3 The President informed that CILT Malaysia has made the following Planning from Jan to Dec 2015 – based on the workshop conducted in December 2014:

3.4 The Presidential briefing on the CILTM activities in 2015. Amongst the activities are as follows:

a. Formation of CILTM Alumni:

- CILT-M Alumni section was formed on 17th Nov 2013;
- The Chairman is Y.Bhg Tan Sri Abd Aziz Abd Rahman FCILT;
- The Secretary is Tn. Haji Musa Lebai Mat Salleh FCILT;
- Ex-officio is Mej. Chang Kah Loon; and
- Few meetings and functions were conducted between the alumni and the Council Members to ensure close relationship and to seek advice from the seniors.



- b. Final Project Presentation by the Royal Malaysia Navy Officers has been conducted for the last 3 years;
- every year RMN will send 30 officers for the course;
 - in 2015 only 13 officers presented the project.
- c. Workshop on Accelerating Growth in Services Sector in Malaysia:
- The workshop was conducted by CILTM and MSPC and was held at Hilton Hotel Petaling Jaya on 11th July 2015, attended by the CILT Malaysia President, Vice President, Secretary General, Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer, WILAT Chairperson and few council members; MSPC was represented by Ir. Choo Kok Beng, President of MSPC and En. Shaifubahrim bin Mohd Saleh, Immediate Past President of MSPC.
- d. Malaysia Professional Centre (BIM) Annual Dinner 2015
- Held on 10th June 2015 at Hotel Istana, Kuala Lumpur. Attended by the CILTM Trustee and former CILT International President, YBhg Tan Sri Dato Dr Abdul Aziz bin Abdul Rahman FCILT;
 - YBhg Tan Sri Dato Dr Abdul Aziz bin Abdul Rahman FCILT received the Award of Excellence from BIM which was presented by YB Puan Hajah Nancy Haji Shukri, Minister from the Prime Minister's Department.
- e. Celebration of CILTM 50th Anniversary on 16th June 2015.
- The soft launch was done by conducting a media conference at CILTM Secretariat Office in Shah Alam.
 - The cutting of the anniversary cake was attended by the President and a few council members and staff.
- f. Hari Raya Open House
- An open house in conjunction with the Muslim's Aidilfitri 1436 celebrations as well as to celebrate the 50th Anniversary of CILTM was held on 9th August 2015 at Kelab Sultan Sulaiman, Kampung Baru, Kuala Lumpur.
 - Among the VIPs who attended were YAB Tun Ling Liong Sik FCILT, the former Minister of Transport Malaysia, YBhg Tan Sri Dato Abdul Aziz Abdul Rahman FCILT, YBhg Tan Sri Halim Mazmin FCILT, CILTM council members and CILT Corporate Members.
- g. Majlis Konsultansi Bajet 2016
- The President and Treasurer of CILTM attended the Majlis Konsultansi Bajet 2016 on 15th June 2015 at Putrajaya International Convention Centre chaired by Prime Minister YAB Dato' Sri Najib bin Tun Haji Abdul Razak.
 - CILTM submitted a proposal paper titled "Proposal for Development of Centre for Logistics & Transport in Malaysia", prepared by CILTM Assistant Treasurer, Dr Kasypi Mokhtar CMILT and presented by the President during the discussion.
- h. Centre of Logistics and Transport Industry. CILT Malaysia submit the proposal for Centre of Logistics and Transport Industry to MITI.

Objectives of having the centre are:-

- a. assist the activities required to support the national logistics and transport industry i.e. information, statistics, policies, etc. regarding all modes of transports (Land, Air, Sea and Pipeline);
- b. to be a one stop centre for the industry to approach for consultation and projects with regards to logistics, operations and transportation problems;



- c. To assist the regulatory bodies in strengthening the institutional and regulatory framework.
- d. The potential of logistics output is expected to reach 4.3% by 2020 (RM50.8 billion) from the current 3.6%.
- i. Formation of a holding company named CILT Ventures Malaysia Sdn. Bhd.
- The President informed that CILT Malaysia has registered a holding company named CILT Ventures Malaysia Sdn. Bhd. However, no activities and capital injection being made to the company yet.
- j. Institutional accreditation
- CILT Malaysia has accredited 16 Institutions and Universities Programme.
 - Future collaboration and accreditation will be with UPNM (Malaysia National Defense University) KUISAS (Kolej Universiti Islam Sultan Azlan Shah) and Meritus University.
- k. JPA Recognition
- JPA recognition on the CILT PQE Logistics still remain as an outstanding issue.
 - More than 300 graduates (Chartered Members) affected since 2010 as they faced opportunity loss in employment promotions, denied opportunity to further studies especially in Master's level at local universities, loss of eligibility to convert study loans into scholarship etc.
 - CILT Malaysia will continue to negotiate with MOHE /JPA to obtain the recognition.
- l. MiTRANS Contract
- CILT Malaysia Management Council decided not to renew the contract with MiTRANS as CILTM Examination Board which will be expiring in July 27, 2015. The reasons for discontinuing the contract are as follows:
 - (a) The enrolment in PQE Transport and PQE Logistics are decreasing and does not justify MiTRANS involvement in the EB as lesser number of students taking examinations;
 - (b) CILT Malaysia is having income shrinkage and inadequate fund to pay for examination costs charged by MiTRANS;
 - (c) CILT Malaysia is developing new PQE Logistics and Transport program equivalent to Bachelor's Degree and in the midst of getting MQA and JPA recognition and approval;
 - (d) CILT Malaysia is currently focusing on accrediting Diploma and Degree programs offered by local Higher Education Providers (HEP). In the absence of MiTRANS, CILT Malaysia will depend on the internal Examination Board.
- m. The Malaysia logistics master plan 2015
- Launched by Malaysia Prime Minister on March 16,2015;
 - CILT Malaysia requested to be involved in the Human Capital Development;
 - Currently negotiating with MOT and MITI for CILT Malaysia involvement in the master plan i.e. Logistics Services Provider Accreditation Centre.
- n. CILT International Convention 2014
- The CILT International Convention 2014 was hosted by CILT Malaysia at Hatten Hotel Melaka and officiated by the Guest of Honour, YAB Datuk Seri Ir Hj Idris Haron, Chief Minister of Melaka.
 - Twelve deserving winners from Logistics and Transport fraternity were awarded with Excellence Category Awards. More than 600 guest local and international attended the Gala Dinner and the highlight of the evening was the conferment of CILT Fellowship to YAB Datuk Seri Ir Hj Idris Haron, Chief Minister of Melaka, YBhg Laksamana Tan Sri Abdul Aziz B Hj Jaafar, Chief of Navy and YBhg Tan Sri Dato' Sri Mohd Khamil B Jamil, Group MD of DRB Hicom.

- o. ASEAN Community for Logistics and Transport
- CILT Malaysia will organize an ASEAN community on logistics and transport group that shall meet once a year as practiced by Africa Forum;
 - This shall encompass potential CILT branches in 10 ASEAN countries;
 - CILT Malaysia will work with ASEAN Services Providers Confederation (ASPC) through MSPC and other potential CILT Branches in ASEAN countries to materialize this effort within next two years;
 - Discussions with potential CILT Branches in Thailand, Brunei and other ASEAN countries are in progress.
 - Based on the CILT International Convention 2015 Dubai, the preliminary agreement has been agreed on the following:
 - (a) Regional (ASEAN) International Vice President represented by Malaysia will be working together with East Asian countries; China, Hong Kong, Macau, Taiwan as well as India, Pakistan, Sri Lanka and Bangladesh to promote CILT activities and drive memberships within those countries.
 - (b) The joint efforts will enhance the regions activities such as organizing joint Seminars, Workshops, Roundtable Meetings and outreach Programmes on CILT and Logistics and Transport matters more frequent in a bigger scale;
 - (c) Malaysia will be the hub for coordination among those countries either for general CILT matters or WiLAT or Young Professional issues.
- p. CILT Malaysia 2015 Convocation
- The CILT Convocation will be held on November 7, 2015 (Saturday) at Tun Dr Ismail Hall, PWTC Kuala Lumpur to confer PQE Logistics, PQE Transport and Membership Certificates to almost 500 recipients and to be graced by CILT International President and CILT International Secretary General.
- 3.5 Finally, the President mentioned that 2014 had been a very busy and challenging year for CILT Malaysia, he sincerely invites all members to participate and contribute their time and effort professionally to CILT Malaysia in particular and the Transport and Logistics industry as a whole for the best interest of the Nation. He thanked the council members and the secretariat staff for all their effort and support given to CILTM. To members he sincerely takes the opportunity to thank everyone who had given the support and confidence to him to lead the Institute.
4. To confirm Minutes of the previous Annual General Meeting held on 27th September 2014.
- 4.1 Minutes of AGM held on 27th September 2014 were adopted, proposed by Mr Patmanathan Menon and seconded by Mr Shunmugam A/L Kuppusamy. The meeting confirmed the Minutes.
5. To discuss matters arising from the Minutes.
- 5.1 Assoc Prof Sabariah Mohamad requested the President to deliberate on the item 11.2. The President explained that CILTM holding company has been formed with the name of CILT Ventures Malaysia Sdn Bhd but yet to begin with any activity and capital injection being made to the company. Possible venture will be the Centre of Logistics and Transport. Assoc Prof Sabariah Mohamad suggests that all plans must have a complete proposal for purpose of reference and review in the future.
- 5.2 Assoc Prof Sabariah asked for detail information on the submission to MQA. Dr Mustakim Melan explained that the submission to MQA has been done in July 2014 and awaiting the feedback from MQA.



6. To receive and adopt Management Report of the Institute.

6.1 Refer to page 13 of the Management Report to add the word "Programme" for "List of new accredited Universities Programme (2014).

6.2 The Management Report was adopted, proposed by Mr Patmanathan Menon and seconded by Hjh Zawiah Binti Abdul Majid CMILT. The meeting approved the Management Report.

7. To receive and adopt the Audited Accounts for the financial year ended 31 December 2014.

7.1 Assoc Prof Sabariah Mohamad enquired about the deficit for ICM 2014 amounting of RM292, 817 on item 14 Page 67. The President informed that the ICM 2014 has been divided into the following activities:

- (a) CILT International Meeting
- (b) Conference/Exhibition
- (c) Social
- (d) Welcome Dinner
- (e) Welfare Dinner
- (f) Gala Dinner

CILT Malaysia have appointed an Event Manager to manage the event. However, CILTM do not have sufficient fund to pay for the service, hence CILTM and the Event Manager company had agreed on the profit sharing to cover the cost. Most of the expenditure was to cover the cost of the Conference / Exhibition because CILTM and the Event Manager were unable to sell the booths at the convention centre. Many booths were vacant. However, we managed to pay all the debt in July 2015.

7.2 Mr Patmanathan Menon enquired about the current status of Item 5 Page 63 for the dues from MAP amounting of RM658, 430 as Hj Ahmad had passed away and MAP is not in existence anymore. He suggested that the Management Council to relook on this matter and come up with the proposal for the closure of this case. He also suggested that the council to make decision whether this case should be continued or closed as it has no effect on the CILT operation and only repeating with the same story every year.

7.3 The Audited Accounts for the financial year ended 31 December 2014 were adopted proposed by Mr Jackson Yogarajah and seconded by Mr Rajendran A/L Narayanasamy. The meeting approved the Audited Accounts.

8. To appoint External Auditors of the Institute.

8.1 The meeting proposed to retain the appointment of Ahmad Abdullah & Goh as the External Auditor for 2015 accounts and accepted by the meeting.

9. To elect Honorary Internal Auditor.

9.1 The meeting proposed to retain the appointment of Datuk Mohamad Ashfar Bin Mohamad Ali and Mr See Ken Seau as the Honorary Internal Auditor for 2015 accounts and accepted by the meeting,

She also shared the findings of the research that 20-30% of women holding positions in the decision making level. Dato' Sharifah of WiLAT Malaysia is the resource person of this topic for Global WiLAT

To further enlighten the Empowerment of Women in Logistics and Transport, WiLAT Malaysia as part of the 50th CILTM anniversary has hosted a tea talk on 6th November 2015 at Glenmarie Golf & Country Club with the theme "LIGHT UP THE WAY". WiLAT Global Advisor Dr. Dorothy Chan from Hong Kong shared her views with the attendees on the "Reflection and Aspiration of WILAT", past and future plans of WiLAT Global while the Chief Executive Officer of SME Corporation Malaysia, YBhg Dato' (Dr) Hafsa Hashim, shared her perspective on Empowerment of Women, which inspired the audience at the tea talk. Among the international guests attended the talk were Ms Vicky Khoo from CILT Hong Kong, Madam Nasreen Haque from CILT Pakistan, Ms Kelly Lee from CILT Singapore. The tea talk session was moderated by Associate Professor Norminsham Abdul Kadir from Universiti Teknologi MARA.

APEC WOMEN IN TRANSPORT (WIT)

Amongst the issue discussed was the appreciation to YB Hj Sulaiman and his dedicated team during the ICM 2014 at Melaka. The support and assistance from the Chief of Melaka to make it happen at Melaka Historical City was really appreciated. Later in the afternoon they meet with the Executive Director of Malacca Industrial Skills Development Centre (MISDEC) to discuss on the accreditation program.

9. CILT BRANCH AND CILTM TRAINING PROVIDER IN CHINA

On the 22nd January 2015, the representatives of CILTM with University of Kuala Lumpur (MITEC) were in Zhengzhou, China to discuss on the setting up of a CILT branch as well as CILTM Training Provider in China. Amongst the decisions which were agreed upon were the establishment of a CILT Branch and the appointment of Henan Institute of Education as a Training Provider for CILTM's Programs. In addition, MITEC was awarded the accreditation from CILTM to conduct professional programs at the university.

10. CILT INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION 2015 – DUBAI

CILT UAE hosted The Chartered Institute of Logistics and Transport International Convention in Dubai from 13th – 16th September 2015 at Jumeirah Creekside Hotel, Dubai, United Arab Emirates. CILTM was represented by 6 delegates. Approximately 300 delegates attended The International Convention 2015 including over 200 international delegates from 30 countries. The convention presented an exciting meeting's agenda, workshops, presentations and visits alongside valuable opportunities for socialising and networking. Delegates shared their experience and expertise, working together to develop innovative ideas and participating in discussions. Dato Abd Radzak Abd Malek, who is also the International Vice President (IVP) of CILT International, together with other CILTM delegates, attended the Delegation Meeting chaired by Mr Bernard Auton and Prof Becky Khoo.

Dato' Sharifah Halimah Syed Ahmad, Chairperson WILAT Malaysia presented a paper on "Empowering Women – unlocking women full potentials" at the Global WiLAT Conference which runs concurrently with CILT international events.

REGIONAL OUTPUTS FROM DATO RADZAK AS IVP CILT INTERNATIONAL DURING THE CONVENTION 2015

Dato Abd Radzak Abd Malek led the discussion among the delegates of East Asia & South East Asia Group.

The Group agreed to the following:

4. Include International Vice Presidents, Global Advisors for WiLAT, Secretary General, WiLAT and Young Professional Convenors, Forum Chair.
5. Aim for 3 years from now with consent to plan at 2016 convention.
6. CILT Malaysia to produce a draft MOU which should include the International Council's Governance, determining the host country and who should lead.

**NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR ENDED 31 December 2015**

1. PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

The Institute is principally involved in promoting knowledge of the science and art of transport, providing a source of authoritative views for communication to government, industry and the community and conducting activities such as examinations, seminars, conferences and annual dinners for members. There have been no significant changes in the nature of these activities during the financial year.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

2.1 Basis of accounting

The financial statements of the Institute have been prepared under the historical convention, unless otherwise indicated and comply with Accounting Standards for Private Entities in Malaysia.

2.2 Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment are initially stated at cost and subsequently, at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses.

2.3 Depreciation

Depreciation is provided using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the assets at the following rates :-

Furniture and fittings	40%
Office equipment	40%
Computers	40%
Library books	20%
Cokmar/Mace	20%
Renovation	20%

2.4 Subsidiary company

Subsidiary company is a company in which the Institute has the power to exercise control over the financial and operating policies so as to obtain benefits from their activities.

Investment in subsidiary company is stated at cost less impairment losses, if any.

2.5 Impairment of assets

The carrying amounts of assets including property, plant and equipment are reviewed for impairment at each balance sheet date. Impairment is measured by comparing the recoverable amount with the carrying amount of an asset and when the latter amount is higher, the asset is written down to the recoverable amount. The recoverable amount of an asset is the higher of its net selling price and its value in use, which is measured by reference to discounted future cash flows.

An impairment loss is charged to the statement of income and expenditure immediately, unless the asset is carried at revalued amount. Any impairment loss of a revalued asset is treated as a revaluation decrease to the extent of previously recognised revaluation surplus for the same asset. Should the



impairment loss of an asset exceed its revaluation surplus, the excess is charged to the statement of income and expenditure.

Subsequent increase in the recoverable amount of an asset if carried at cost, is treated as a reversal of the accumulated impairment loss previously recognised in the statement of income and expenditure but the reversal is limited to the accumulated impairment loss previously recognised; and if carried at revalued amount, is credited directly to revaluation surplus.

2.6 Receivables

Receivables are carried at anticipated realisable values. Bad debts are written off in the financial year in which they are identified. An estimate is made for doubtful debts based on a review of all outstanding amounts at the financial year end.

2.7 Payables

Payables are stated at the amounts which the Institute is contracted or obligated to settle plus any incidental legal expenses.

2.8 Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the Institute has a present legal and contractual obligation as a result of a past event, when it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation, and when a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation.

2.9 Taxation

Current taxation is the expected amount of income taxes payable in respect of the taxable profit for the financial year. It is calculated using the tax rates that have been enacted at the balance sheet date.

2.10 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents consist of cash in hand, bank balances and fixed deposits which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash.

2.11 Revenue recognition

All income including surplus from other activities is recognised on the accrual basis unless probability of collection is remote.

2.12 Employee benefits

Wages, salaries and bonuses are recognised as expenses in the financial year in which the associated services are rendered by employees. Short-term accumulating compensated absences such as paid annual leave are recognised when services are rendered by employees that increase their entitlement to future compensated absences, if any and short-term non-accumulating compensated absences such as sick leave are recognised when absences occur.

Contributions to defined contribution plan such as the Employees Provident Fund are recognised as expenses in the statement of income and expenditure as they are incurred.

23. LITIGATION

On 11 July 2008, CILTM commenced a legal action against Malaysian Association of Productivity (MAP) claiming the amount of RM729,580.00 due from MAP as at 31 December 2007 (see Note 5 above). On 11 August 2008, CILTM obtained a judgement in default from the High Court for the amount of RM729,580.00, which was set aside on 22 July 2009.

At a hearing in chambers on 7 July 2011, it was ordered that CILTM and MAP reconcile their accounts and come before the High Court on 7 October 2011 for the High Court to record the order of payment of the final amount due from MAP.

At the accounts reconciliation meeting on 22 November 2011, the two parties agreed that amounts totalling RM332,737.53 were due from MAP. CILTM obtained a consent judgement on 19 July 2012 for the amount of RM332,737.53 due from MAP.

In respect of the amounts of RM70,700.00 and RM174,275.00 being GDLM fees and examination fees respectively owing by MAP, CILTM applied to the High Court for a Summary Judgement which was heard on 12 September 2012. The High Court ordered MAP to pay the amounts of RM70,700.00 and RM174,275.00 claimed by CILTM. MAP appealed against the decision and filed an appeal at the Court of Appeal which was heard on 16 April 2013.

The Court of Appeal granted the appeal of MAP. CILTM could not obtain a fresh order for the purpose of execution of the Consent Judgement due to MAP being a Society which is inactive and dormant. Thus, any effort of correspondence and application to the Court could not be executed.
