Website

The website was successfully transferred to its own server and is operative. Philippines have used the event registration area of the website successfully and we are confident that they can start engaging again with potential members.

The booking system for events provides a list of registered attendees that they can download and create a distribution list, with the hope of converting these attending non-members to member status. The booking system contact details of non-members is captured.

It was an extremely big job going through the website and database and changing items from CILTA to CILTPH. This work is mostly being done by Australia (Karyn Welsh) and was extremely time consuming. Philippines now need to spend time becoming familiar with the website and how it operates. Training videos have been provided to the administrative Support area in the Philippines.

Philippines admin Support has been impacted by COVID with some family members losing their life and others put into quarantine.

- 2) **Conduct Regular Surveys:** As we plan to carry out a survey that will be crucial on renewal and gaining members. This survey will help us understand what our existing members want. This is available within our new website as well which is excellent for us too. Survey functions and sample surveys are on the website for the Philippines to utilise if they wish to.

The idea of the survey is to know why members wish to join our Institute. Is it to learn about a specific topic? Once they've mastered that subject, will they'll leave?
